



Uzbekistan Regional TNE Symposium 2026

Theme: *TNE Quality Assurance and Inclusion in the Context of Growth*

Taking place on 3–4 March 2026, the Regional TNE Symposium builds on the Uzbekistan–UK Education Forum series and aims to address key priorities for higher education at national and regional levels, within the context of international transnational education (TNE). The 2026 Symposium will focus on quality assurance in the context of significant growth in TNE in Uzbekistan and the wider region, highlighting how institutions are responding to rapid expansion in TNE provision while safeguarding academic standards and student outcomes. Throughout the programme, discussions will explore the impact of higher education policy, practice, and partnerships in supporting sustainable, high-quality TNE provision.

The Symposium is organised in partnership with the Ministry of Higher Education, Science and Innovations of the Republic of Uzbekistan, the British Council, Westminster International University in Tashkent, and Uzbekistan's TNE Good Practice Network. On the second day, participants will have the opportunity to join campus visits to selected universities in Tashkent that play a key role in the delivery of UK TNE.
